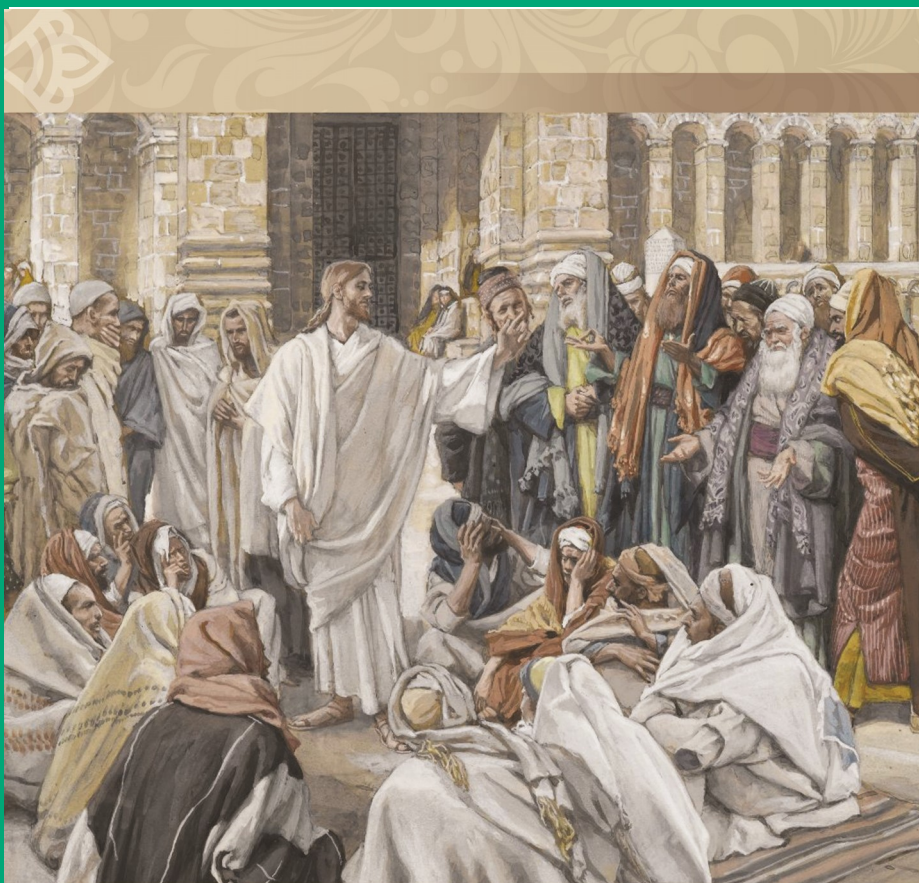

Stewardship Message— “Fully Alive as Missionary Disciples” Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Ecc 1:2, 2:21-23 Col 3:1-5, 9-11 Lk 12:13-21

When we look at today’s readings, we see examples of the anti-stewardship mindset. In the first reading, we have Qoheleth, who basically minimizes the value of life to his wealth and possessions, of which he has none. His tone is somewhat resentful that for all his hard work, he has nothing to show for it at the end of his life. Then in the Gospel, Jesus has to point out possessions are not the indicator of a “rich” life, and that we should “take care to guard against all greed.” Being a good steward means showing gratitude by sharing our blessings and using them to enrich the lives of one another. It does not mean building bigger barns to store the gifts we have been given. This applies not only to our wealth and possessions, but to every aspect of our lives as disciples. Let us open our minds and hearts to our call to stewardship!

CATHOLIC DOCTRINAL SECTION

“The priest continues the work of redemption on earth” (CCC 1589). The ordination of the priest “gives him a sacred power” (CCC 1592), which is irreplaceable, because through it Jesus becomes sacramentally present in His saving action. Therefore, priests voluntarily opt for celibacy as “a sign of new life” (CCC 1579). It is about the self-giving in the service of Christ and His coming kingdom. With a view to receiving the ordination in the three stages of this ministry, the Church is “bound by the choice made by the Lord Himself. That is why it is not possible to ordain women” (CCC 1577). To imply that this impossibility is somehow a form of discrimination against women shows only the lack of understanding for this sacrament, which is not about earthly power but the representation of Christ, the Bridegroom of the Church.

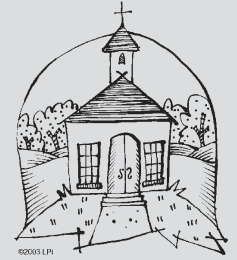
RESPECT LIFE & SOCIAL JUSTICE
