Stewardship Message—

“Fully Alive as Missionary Disciples”

Sir 3:17-18, 20, 28-29 Heb 12:18-19, 22-24a Lk 14:1, 7-14
22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our baptism calls us into a life of stewardship, which requires generosity and humility. We have received many gifts, and are asked to use them for the good of one another. We are called to share these gifts with others, be it in the form of money or service, with no expectation of repayment. Additionally, we should not flaunt our wealth or our social status. Rather, Jesus says, “The one who humbles himself will be exalted.” In today’s Gospel, Jesus addresses the Pharisees, who are contending for places of honor at the table. Most of us have likely been guilty of this behavior before – seeking affirmation and giving undue attention to people of popularity. We can all benefit from the lesson of this parable: that it is only in lowering ourselves that we can be raised up. Saint Augustine said, “There is something in humility which strangely exalts the heart.” When we stop putting ourselves before others, we can finally begin living a life of holiness.

DOCTRINAL SECTION

"The Kingdom of God begun here below in the Church of Christ is not of this world whose form is passing, and its proper growth cannot be confounded with the progress of civilization, of science or of human technology, but it consists in an ever more profound knowledge of the unfathomable riches of Christ, an ever stronger hope in eternal blessings, an ever more ardent response to the love of God, and an ever more generous bestowal of grace and holiness among men. The deep solicitude of the Church, the Spouse of Christ, for the needs of men, for their joys and hopes, their griefs and efforts, is therefore nothing other than her great desire to be present to them, in order to illuminate them with the light of Christ and to gather them all in Him, their only Savior. This solicitude can never mean that the Church conforms herself to the things of this world, or that she lessens the ardor of her longing of her Lord and of the eternal Kingdom" (Paul VI, Apostolic letter Solemnis hac liturgia (Credo of the People of God), 27). 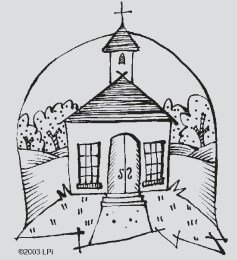
