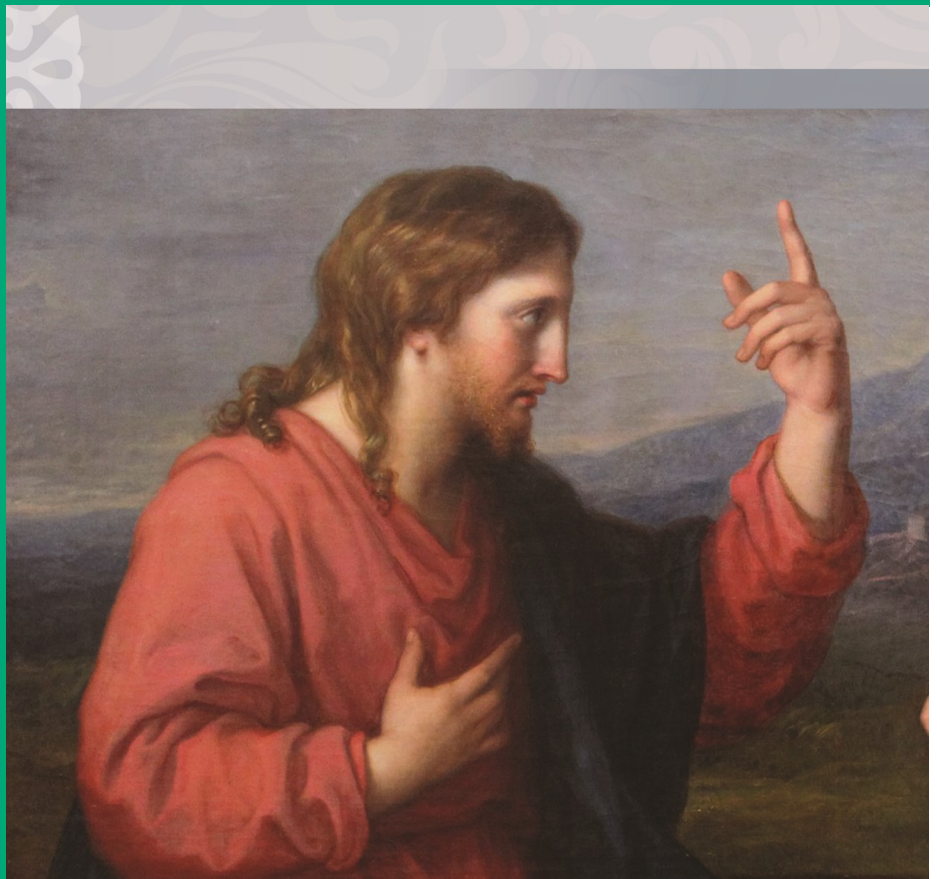

Stewardship Message—Empowered! “Fully Alive as Missionary Disciples” Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mal 3:19-20a / 2 Thes 3:7-12 / Lk 21:5-19

It is not unusual for Christian disciples to wonder about the “end times.” In today’s Gospel, Jesus speaks to the destruction of the temple, which would have signaled the end of time for the Jews of His day. Jesus knows this and tries (once again) to explain that there is no way to anticipate the day or the hour of the end of time. If we are fully alive in our discipleship, then we do not have time nor need to worry about when the end might arrive. Jesus says we are not to ponder these things, but have faith that the Holy Spirit will give us the wisdom we need when we need it. We have been called into a service that lasts until the very end...whenever that may be. Remain fully alive in your mission and allow the Spirit to empower you for the difficult days you will endure. Jesus promises that “not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives.”

DOCTRINAL SECTION

We believe in the Holy Spirit, who is Lord and Giver of life, who is adored and glorified together with the Father and the Son. He spoke to us by the prophets; He was sent by Christ after His resurrection and His ascension to the Father; He illuminates, vivifies, protects and guides the Church; He purifies the Church's members if they do not shun His grace. His action, which penetrates to the inmost of the soul, enables man to respond to the call of Jesus: Be perfect as your Heavenly Father is perfect (Mt. 5:48). We believe that in Adam all have sinned, which means that the original offense committed by him caused human nature, common to all men, to fall to a state in which it bears the consequences of that offense, and which is not the state in which it was at first in our first parents – established as they were in holiness and justice, and in which man knew neither evil nor death. It is human nature so fallen, stripped of the grace that clothed it, injured in its own natural powers and subjected to the dominion of death, that is transmitted to all men, and it is in this sense that every man is born in sin. We therefore hold, with the Council of Trent, that original sin is transmitted with human nature, "not by imitation, but by propagation" and that it is thus "proper to everyone." ~ St. Paul VI

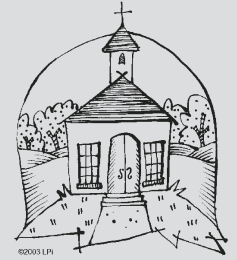

NEW HOPE SHELTER

New Hope's activity during our week of volunteering: Oct. 30 - Nov 5, 2019. (St. Mary, Our Lady of Guadalupe and Sacred Heart) 3 new residents entered the shelter; 1 resident left, 10 of our residents were already employed and 4 gained employment, 4 are on Disability/Social Security. We served 10 single men and 8 single women and 3 family units consisting of 3 moms and 1 father and 8 children. We also dispensed 5 food boxes to people from the community in need. We supported this mission by providing 7 evening meals, evening volunteers for 7 nights, and overnight volunteers for 2 nights totaling 132 hours of service.
