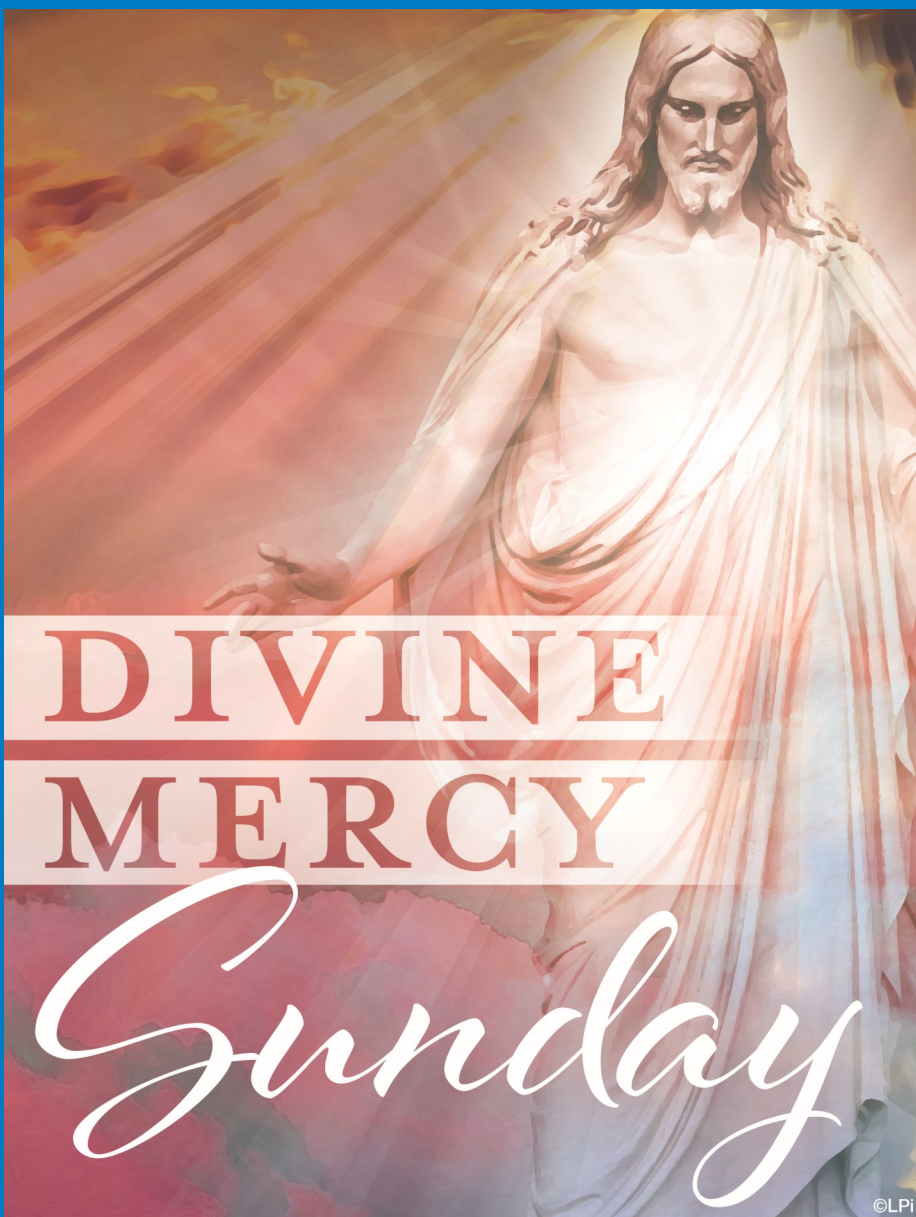

## Stewardship Message— Sunday of Divine Mercy

Acts 5:12-16 / Ps 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24 / Rev 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19 / Jn 20:19-31

The Fear of Missing Out, or FOMO, has been around longer than Methuselah. FOMO can bring good and/or undesirable consequences. Adam and Eve learned that the hard way. In today's first reading we read there were those that would do anything to get to the apostles, even settling for the shadow of Peter to cast upon them, they did not want to miss out on the opportunity of a lifetime! Then, in today's gospel, there is Thomas, the doubting one. Can you imagine what he felt after hearing Jesus showed up while he was gone? Total FOMO alert. Where was he anyway? Obviously, Jesus being God and all, knew Thomas was not going to be present, and he also knew Thomas was going to be doubtful about his appearance. God's timing is not our timing. God knows we can't be everywhere, doing everything, and as stewards we can't be a part of every event or ministry. Divine Mercy Sunday is a good reminder we needn't be here or there or doing this or that, we just need to be open.

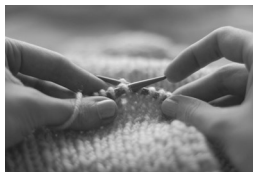
### St. Vincent de Paul
