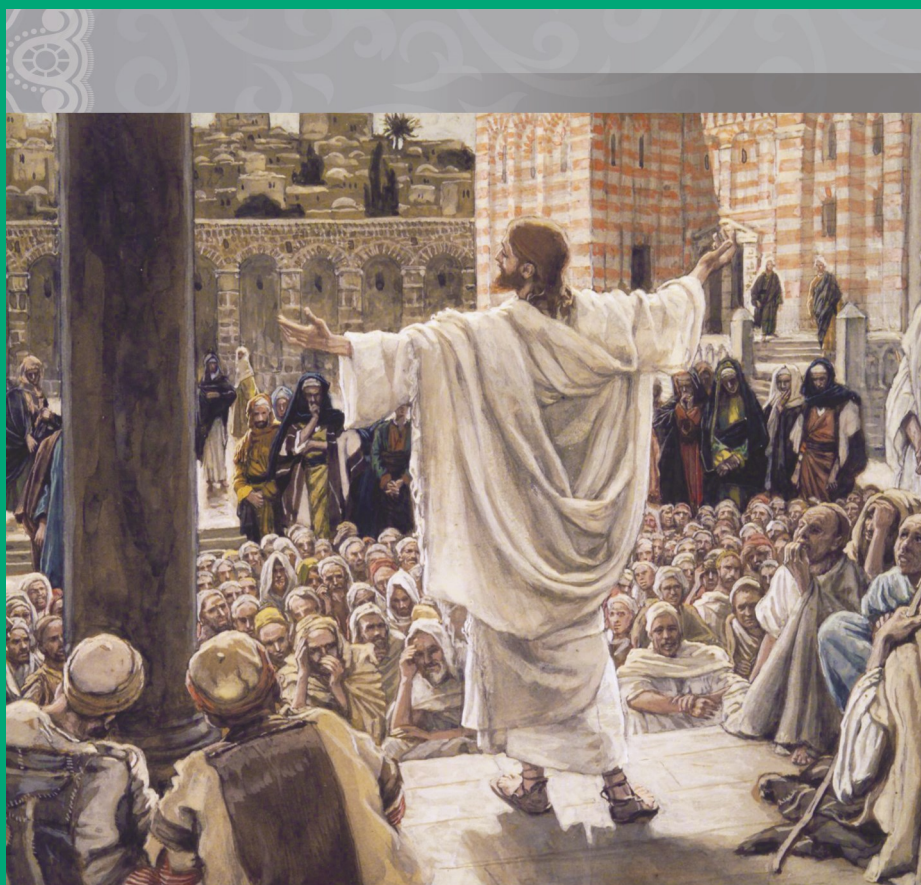

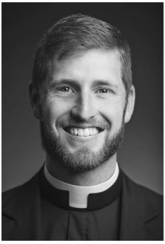

Eucharistic Miracles of the World

St. Marys will be hosting the Eucharistic Miracles of the World exhibit next weekend. It is a traveling display featuring 56 beautiful panels that highlight some of the most powerful Eucharistic miracles in the world. This is a great opportunity to learn about the incredible miracles pertaining to the Eucharist, and fitting in light of this being, "The Year of the Eucharist." These Vatican-approved miracles have been created by an Italian teenager, Servant of God, Carlo Actus. Carlo died from leukemia the year after he completed this project. They will be on display in the Parish Center after the weekend Masses on Aug. 20 & 21.

I am a lifelong Catholic, but I recognize the importance of deepening my faith, it is a gift from God that can never be exhausted. The greater one's faith, the greater the foundation on which to build one's spiritual life. Besides praying for greater faith, there are many things a person can do to better receive this gift; and I'm confident that visiting the Eucharist exhibit is one such example. Miracles are not exact proofs for the mysteries of our faith, but they are what theologians call, 'modes of credibility.' They offer tremendous support to our claims of faith, they add credence to what we believe.

A holy monk once said, "The degree of each one's holiness will be in exact proportion to his participation in the Eucharist, for the Lamb of God alone is holy." The Eucharist is at the center of our Catholic religion, and it's what sets us apart from all other Christians. A greater faith and deeper love for the Eucharist will no doubt make us more grateful for this supreme gift of ours. And gratitude is the key to growth in holiness. Visiting the exhibit next weekend could certainly contribute to our faith and love for our Lord in the Eucharist. I hope to see you there and invite a friend.
