Dear Parishioners,
 The St. Vincent de Paul Society is a Catholic ministry dedicated to serving people who are poor, suffering, or marginalized through direct personal assistance and compassionate friendship. Founded in 1833 by Frédéric

Ozanam in Paris, the ministry seeks to live out the Gospel by helping those in need with food, clothing, rent assistance, spiritual support, and personal accompaniment. Members, often called “Vincentians,” focus not only on meeting material needs but also on recognizing the dignity of every person as a child of God. As Jesus identified Himself with the poor and vulnerable, Catholic teaching strongly supports this type of ministry. In the Gospel of Matthew, Christ teaches, “Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me.” The Church teaches that acts of charity are essential expressions of faith and part of the Christian call to love one’s neighbor. Caring for the poor reflects the Catholic principles of human dignity and solidarity.

A personal connection is especially important in Catholic ministry because charity is not meant to be impersonal or transactional. Jesus ministered through relationships, listening, healing, and walking with people in their struggles. The St. Vincent de Paul ministry follows this example by emphasizing face-to-face encounters with the people who request financial assistance. Our parish chapter of the SVdP Society is looking for new parishioners to help respond to requests for help and meet with these individuals.
