"What Gifts Do I Share?"

Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

What gifts do I share? In the Old Testament Ezekiel received messages from the Lord and was told to share them with God's chosen people. Due to God's gift, Ezekiel became responsible for his countrymen. St. Paul explains to the Romans the length we must go to fulfill the commandments - Love your neighbor as you love yourself. The Gospel message is one of sharing the Kingdom through instruction, forgiveness and prayer. When we listen to the Word of God we often receive gifts of peace and understanding. As disciples, our life should center on sharing the message of the Lord. May we hear our Lord with understanding and share the message in love.

The third season of *That Man Is You*, Revelation of the Father, begins on September 20th. We will be meeting in the St. Mary Parish Center at 6:30 for breakfast. The program will begin at 7:00. Men from the *That Man is You* program will be in the vestibule of church following mass the weekend of September 13th and 14th. You can enroll then or at the first session the following weekend.

TMIY YEAR 3 : REVELATION OF THE FATHER

The third year of the *That Man is You!* program (*launching Fall 2014*), entitled *The Revelation of the Father*, considers man in his relationship to his children. It is modeled on the life of St. Joseph, the man chosen to be the foster father of Jesus Christ, God Incarnate.

The Fall semester considers the reality of fatherhood and discovers a mystery far deeper than a simple biological reality. Integrating the latest medical science with the vision of St. Joseph presented in Scripture, *The Revelation of the Father* discovers a mystery that touches God. Indeed, men "relive and reveal on earth the very fatherhood of God" (Cf. Pope John Paul II, *Familiaris Consortio*, #25). This spiritual reality has attracted the enmity of Satan. As such, *The Revelation of the Father* takes an honest look at the challenges facing fathers in modern culture.

The Spring semester considers the moral environment confronting youth and sets forth the vision of a child capable of making moral decisions in the face of significant pressure. It discovers in St. John Bosco's Preventive System of Education the parenting method perfectly suited to modern times. It integrates the Seven Steps to a Healthy, Happy, Holy Family with Don Bosco's Preventive method to provide practical guidance to parents in developing a "parenting plan of life."



It is now time to listen, listen intently to the Spirit. The time has come to follow that Spirit. See you Sunday afternoon at 2 pm in the St. Mary Parish Center.

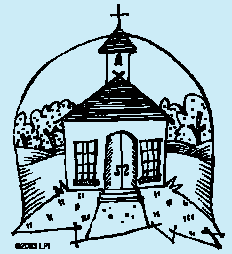
