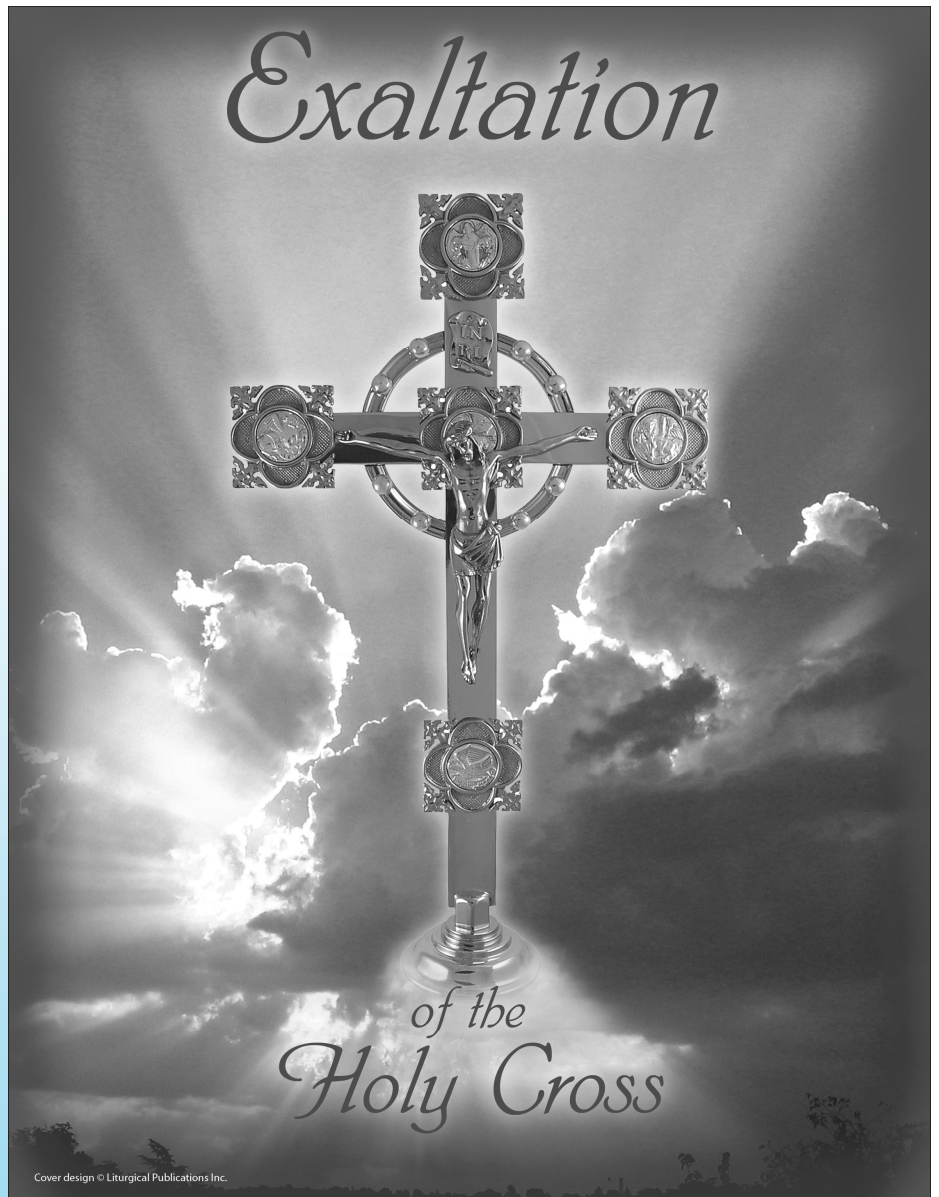

Exaltation of the Holy Cross

The third season of That Man Is You, Revelation of the Father, begins on September 20th. We will be meeting in the St. Mary Parish Center at 6:30 for breakfast. The program will begin at 7:00. TMIY YEAR 3 : REVELATION OF THE FATHER

The third year of the That Man is You! program (*launching Fall 2014*), entitled *The Revelation of the Father*, considers man in his relationship to his children. It is modeled on the life of St. Joseph, the man chosen to be the foster father of Jesus Christ, God Incarnate.

The Fall semester considers the reality of fatherhood and discovers a mystery far deeper than a simple biological reality. Integrating the latest medical science with the vision of St. Joseph presented in Scripture, *The Revelation of the Father* discovers a mystery that touches God. Indeed, men "relive and reveal on earth the very fatherhood of God" (Cf. Pope John Paul II, *Familiaris Consortio*, #25). This spiritual reality has attracted the enmity of Satan. As such, *The Revelation of the Father* takes an honest look at the challenges facing fathers in modern culture.

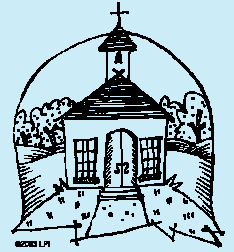
