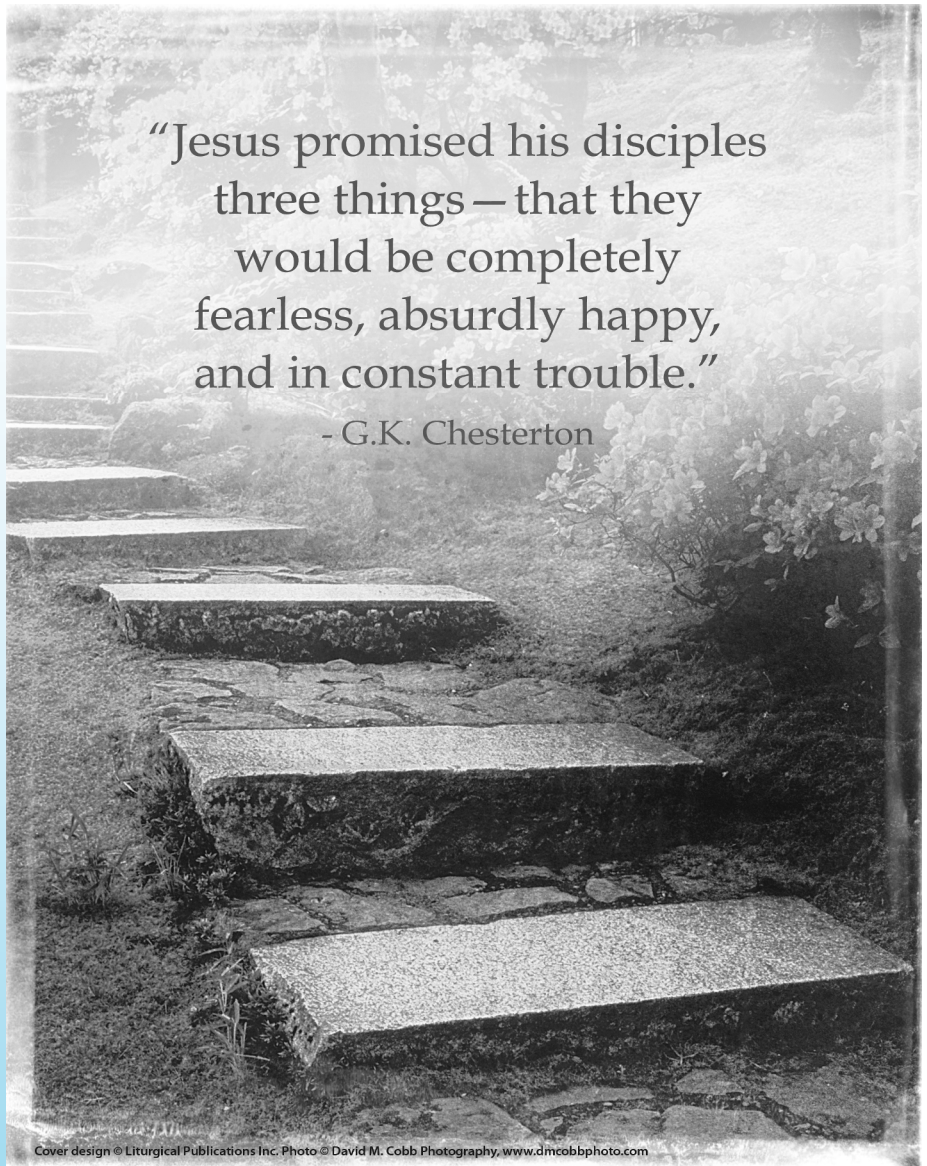

"The Joy of the Gospel: Faith Working Through Love"

Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

This is your last chance! How often do we hear these words used in trying to sell something or to influence a change in behavior? The Joy of the Gospel is that God will give us another chance. When we turn away from sin our heavenly Father welcomes us and stands ready with forgiveness and mercy. The readings today make this point clearly. The prophet Ezekiel admonishes his listeners for thinking that God's ways are unfair and explains the mercy the Lord shows to the repentant sinner. The question Jesus poses to the chief priests helped them see that doing the right thing later is better than not doing it at all. May our faith in God be fulfilled in the love we display toward our neighbor.

Our Lives Change When Our Habits Change



Matthew Kelly has inspired millions with the message that there is genius in Catholicism, but if the Church is to avoid falling into obscurity, individual Catholics must demonstrate its relevance through a dedication to becoming the best version of themselves. Q How can a person who was cremated or blown up be resurrected if their pieces are scattered or lost?

A When the Sadducees wanted to disprove the idea of life after death, they asked Jesus a question about marriage. Mosaic law required a man to marry his brother's widow if she is childless. They proposed a situation where seven brothers married the same widow, and she was childless when she died. Whose wife would she be? Jesus answers by saying that they were still thinking in terms of this life, not the life to come.

The same can be said about resurrection. It is a reality that is not governed by the laws of earthly existence, but rather the laws of eternity. The resurrected and glorified body is a new creation of God. The body is resurrected not in its old form, but in its new form. Remember how the apostles did not recognize Jesus after the Resurrection? He was glorified, yet still the same. This is why the tadpole and caterpillar are used to explain resurrection. They both become a new creation when they emerge as frogs and butterflies. So will we. The old parts just don't fit on the new model!

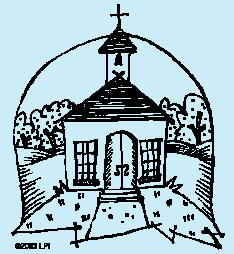
