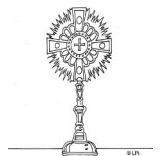

### "The Joy of the Gospel: Faith Working Through Love"

Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

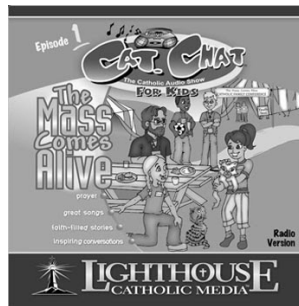
Produce good fruit! The first reading and the Gospel use stories of vineyards to illustrate our obligation to use our gifts to do good works. Isaiah's story of a vineyard producing wild grapes strongly accused the Israelites of turning their backs on the God who delivered them from Egypt and, in the process, turning their backs on the poor and vulnerable among them. Jesus told of a vineyard leased to tenants who refused to share the produce with the landowner. This accusation was directed to the chief priests and elders, who were in charge of teaching and leading the Jewish people, but consistently abused their authority and did little to spread the love of God. As we contemplate the love the Father has for us, may we always care for our neighbor with the same love.

## St. Mary School Happenings

Would you enjoy working with a child to help them with either mathematics or reading? Do you have one hour a week to make a difference? St. Mary is looking for volunteer tutors to help. Each tutor will be given materials from the school. Times would be after school from 3:30-4:30pm and day of the week is determined by the volunteer.

St. Mary Catholic School teachers attended a diocesan in-service on bullying prevention and how to make sure the school environment is safe for students. The day of workshops was hosted at Bishop Carroll. Fr. John Lanzrath celebrated Mass.

The official enrollment for St. Mary is 189 students. This is an increase of 16 students and the third largest increase in the Wichita Diocese.

The free/reduced count for 2014-15 is 61.1%. This will again qualify St. Mary as a Title I and Drexel Fund school.

## St. Vincent de Paul Newton Conference progress report

The Newton Conference has gotten off to a great start. Two weeks ago all Wichita Council Conferences received a request for All Saints Conference to assist them in providing for several families. This parish has two separate communities that are impoverished within the boundaries of its mission. This translates to periodic requests from other Conferences to help out. This process is known in the Vincentian community as twinning. When the request came your Newton Conference chose to send \$200 to All Saints. The following week we had three home visits triggered by referrals. Two of the referrals were from both of our parishes and the third was a Harvey county resident not affiliated with either parish. Two of the referrals were for emergency assistance with rent. These situations were both triggered by a combination of lost or limited employment, serious family and or personal illness and lack of other available supports. We contributed \$550 toward these two situations. Our third visit was to assist an individual living on very income and who was facing an unanticipated major auto repair. It was felt that without the auto being functional this persons independence would be significantly impaired. \$200 has been allocated to this situation pending completion of the repairs. In all three families and eight lives in our community were assisted in our first two weeks of operation. We are still discussing and discerning the guidelines we will be relying on in determining our capacity to serve. If we have learned anything in the past two weeks it would be there is no longer doubt as to the existence of the need for this ministry. ### Sacrament of Reconciliation

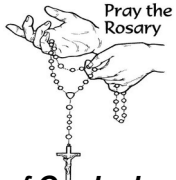
