**"The Joy of the Gospel: Faith Working Through Love"**  
 Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

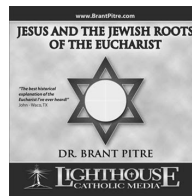
Love your neighbor as yourself. These words come from Jesus as second in importance only to the command to love the Lord with one's whole heart, soul and mind. In Christ's answer to the testing by the Pharisees he summarized the entirety of the law and prophets contained in the Hebrew Scriptures. While the scholars of the law knew that the wrath of God would visit them if they preyed upon widows, orphans, aliens and their poor neighbors, they did not understand the law as a command to love their neighbor. Jesus' words reach us today as a reminder that a person in need is our neighbor and we have a duty to address those needs. St. Paul praises the Thessalonians for taking the message of the Gospel to heart and serving each other in faith and love. As we contemplate the words of our Lord, may his light show us the path to the Kingdom.

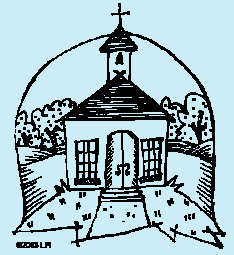
