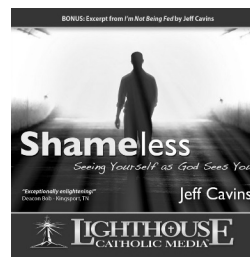

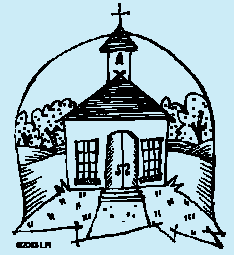

November: Month of All Souls

The Liturgical Month of November is the month of All Souls. We pray for the faithfully departed. The souls of the departed need our prayers. It is believed that as we pray for them, those souls will intercede for us. Did you know that if you go to the cemetery, and pray for your loved ones and others still yet to enjoy the fullness of heaven, between November 1 through November 8, one can gain a plenary indulgence (DAILY), under the usual conditions of Confession, Mass, and Holy Communion. The plenary indulgence is only applicable for the poor souls. (Manual of Indulgences).

November 2 is the Feast of All Souls. It is customary to visit a church, pray one Our Father, one Hail Mary, the Creed, and to pray one Our Father, one Hail Mary, and one Glory Be, for the intentions of the Holy Father. One may also gain a plenary indulgence for this act of mercy. On November 2, at 5:00pm, Legion representatives will be at St. Mary's cemetery, and pray the above prayers. All parishioners are welcome.

A basket will be placed in the vestibule. Please place the names of your loved ones that have died, in this basket, and the Legion of Mary, during the month of November, will remember your loved ones in our daily prayers.

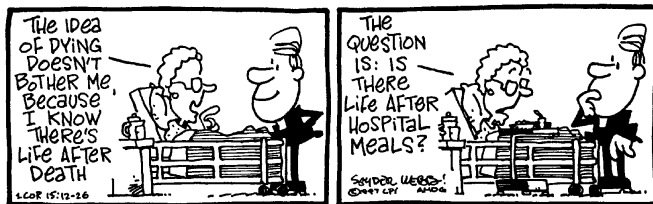
