## **A letter from Fr. Bergkamp:**

**Dear Parents,**

**Catholic Schools Week is something that's still relatively new to me. It's not something I grew up with, as I didn't attend a Catholic school until I was 22 years old, when I entered seminary. However, the importance of this celebration and participating in the festivities that go along with it are not lost on me. It's a reminder that having access to a Catholic School is a real blessing, something we should not take for granted. It also provides a great opportunity to call to mind and have conversations about what it takes to sustain this gift. Finally, it's a great chance to double down on our commitments to supporting the school, and enjoy a renewed excitement about everything going on in and around the school.**

**Receiving a good education is a blessing in and of itself. Less we forget, learning leads to knowledge of reality, which is worth pursuing for its own sake because this is how we come to possess truth; and possession of truth is to participate in the reality of God. Receiving a Catholic education is to enjoy this pursuit of truth in a more dynamic and personal way, as faith is afforded its necessary role in education. This is the faith revealed by Christ, who is truth itself and the fulfillment of man.**

**Catholic Schools Week is a perfect time to talk with your children about the blessing which is Catholic education. Let them know that this is not something every child has access to, and that if we lived in almost any other part of the country, they and or some of their classmates would not enjoy this opportunity. Explain to them how unique this is and what makes it possible. It's important for all of us to understand that these efforts must be renewed if we hope the next generation is to receive the same opportunity.**

**At this point your stewardship forms have been returned to the parish office and hopefully you committed to helping directly with school related needs or indirectly by helping around your parish. Now comes the hard part, following through. When you're called upon to help in a given ministry, remember it takes everyone's effort to make Catholic education a possibility. But beyond mere responsibility, it is fulfilling to play an active role in something greater than ourselves. And there is a rewarding joy to participating in social events such as the school auction. Thank you for your continued support, which makes the future life of St. Mary's exciting; and with you, I thank God for the blessing which is our Catholic school.**

## **From the Front Office:**

Pre-enrollment will be opening on March 9, 2023. In order to complete pre-enrollment, all outstanding fees from this year should be current AND your stewardship envelope should already be on file with your local parish office (this was due before Jan 1st). This is an important step to having a Parish-Family Agreement signed by your Pastor, and the PFA must be on file with your parish so that pre-enrollment can be completed with the school office. Without a Parish-Family Agreement on file, a payment plan for tuition would need to be set up with Mary Ann in the St. Mary Parish office prior to completing pre-enrollment for the 2023-2024 school year.

If your stewardship forms are not completed with your parish, please reach out to your parish secretary ASAP to complete this necessary step. Families who do not have a Parish-Family agreement on file with their Parish Office before pre-enrollment opens will not be able to pre-enroll for next year until this step is completed.

If you have outstanding fees due to the school, please make payment in the front office with Miss Jackie or establish a payment plan in the St. Mary Parish office with Mary Ann. All fees must be current, or a payment plan established prior to pre-enrollment for next year.

## **Dress for Success!**

1) As listed in the school handbook (pg. 18), it is required that the length of jumpers and skirts must be at least knee length. Students who arrive to school without at least knee length skirts/ jumpers will need to change. Parents will be contacted to see if they are able to bring an alternative uniform option or would prefer to have their child borrow from the uniform closet that day, with what is available. If an alternate option is not available, a parent will need to either bring a suitable option or pick their child up from school that day. This would be an unexcused absence. Skirt and jumper length will be actively monitored after Spring break.

Please double check the length of your daughter's skirts/ jumpers and make arrangements prior to return from spring break.
